

# Will Coinbase refund if scammed?(Unauthorized transaction)

If you fall victim to a scam while using Coinbase, [+1-(915)→201-4928] getting your money back is **rare** [+1-(915)→201-4928] and not something most users experience. Cryptocurrency transactions are built to be **permanent** [+1-(915)→201-4928] so once funds are sent, they usually cannot be reversed. [+1-(915)→201-4928] Coinbase makes it clear that account security and transaction approval are the responsibility of the user, and every transfer should be carefully checked before confirming.
