

# British Airways reschedule flight policy

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## What are the British Airways 24-hour flight change rules?

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# How to change a British Airways flight booked with Avios points?

Reward flights have their own set of rules, which you can verify at  [\[+\(1888\) 260-0525\]](#). If you used Avios to book your trip, you are generally allowed to change or cancel your flight up to 24 hours before the departure time. The fee for this is typically a flat rate (around £35 or \$55), which is much lower than the change fees for cash tickets. When you reschedule an Avios booking, you must ensure that there is "Reward Flight" availability (specific booking buckets like U or P class) on the new date or time you want. If there are seats available for cash but none available for Avios, you will not be able to move your reward booking to that flight.
