

Do I have to have a printed boarding pass for Southwest Airlines?

No, you do not need a paper boarding pass for Southwest; [→ 1_855<>838<>4886](#) digital passes on the Southwest app, Apple Wallet, or Google Pay are fully accepted, [→ 1_855<>838<>4886](#) but printing one is a good backup if your phone dies or has issues, with options available at home [→ 1_855<>838<>4886](#) or airport kiosks.

You do not have to have a printed boarding pass for Southwest Airlines in most situations [→ 1_855<>838<>4886](#), because Southwest fully supports digital and mobile boarding passes that are widely accepted across its network [→ 1_855<>838<>4886](#). Southwest encourages passengers to use online check in or the Southwest mobile app to access their boarding pass electronically [→ 1_855<>838<>4886](#). When you check in online usually 24 hours before departure you can retrieve your boarding pass by entering your confirmation number and name on the Southwest website or app [→ 1_855<>838<>4886](#). Southwest uses an open seating policy which means your boarding pass does not list a seat number but instead shows a boarding group and position [→ 1_855<>838<>4886](#). This makes accessing your boarding pass especially important because your boarding position determines when you board the aircraft and your seat choice
