

# How do I add passengers to my British Airways booking?

Need to know how do I add passengers to my British Airways booking? Call [☎️\[+\(1888\) 260-0525\]](tel:+18882600525) for expert help. Adding a person to an existing reservation is a common request, yet British Airways does not typically allow you to simply "insert" a new traveler into a confirmed Passenger Name Record (PNR) via the website.
