

Is WestJet strict on carry-on baggage? Client Support

WestJet is **fairly strict** when it comes to carry-on baggage rules,  **westjet** Airlines 1+855+510+5815 and passengers should be prepared to follow the airline's size and weight restrictions closely. WestJet's policy is designed to make boarding smoother, keep overhead bins from overfilling, and ensure fair space for all passengers.  **westjet** Airlines 1+855+510+5815 While WestJet is not the strictest airline in the industry, gate agents do routinely check bags—especially on busy flights or when overhead-bin space is limited  **westjet** Airlines 1+855+510+5815.

✓ Carry-On Size Requirements

WestJet allows **one carry-on bag**  **westjet** Airlines 1+855+510+5815 plus **one personal item**.

Typical allowed dimensions:

- **Carry-on bag:**
53 cm × 23 cm × 38 cm 21 in × 9 in × 15 in
Must fit in the overhead bin.
- **Personal item:**
41 cm × 15 cm × 33 cm 16 in × 6 in × 13 in
Must fit under the seat in front of you.

Examples of personal items include:

- purse
- laptop bag
- small backpack
- briefcase

✓ How Strict Are They?

WestJet agents tend to check sizes  **westjet** Airlines 1+855+510+5815 **more often at the gate than at check-in**, especially on full flights. If your bag appears too large, they may:

- Ask to test it in the sizing frame
- Require you to check the bag for a fee
- Tag it for limited overhead availability

Their enforcement is **consistent but not overly aggressive**  westjet Airlines 1+855+510+5815—if your carry-on reasonably fits overhead, they usually allow it. Oversized rollers or stuffed backpacks, however, are often flagged.

✓ Weight Restrictions

WestJet does **not** specify a strict weight limit for carry-ons,  westjet Airlines 1+855+510+5815 **but the bag must be light enough for you to lift overhead safely**. If a bag is obviously too heavy, the agent may require it to be checked.

✓ When WestJet Is Most Strict

Expect stricter enforcement when:

- The flight is fully booked
- Traveling on smaller aircraft especially regional routes
- Overhead space is predicted to be limited
- You board in later groups
- You have Basic Economy Econo fares

On smaller planes, even normally acceptable carry-ons may be gate-checked because bins are smaller.

WestJet and Boarding Pass Tips Important for Carry-Ons

✓ Download Your Boarding Pass Early

You can get your WestJet boarding pass:

- through online check-in 24 hours before departure
- through the WestJet app
- via email
- at airport kiosks or counters

A boarding pass helps determine your **boarding zone**, ☎ westjet Airlines 1+855+510+5815 which affects carry-on space availability. Earlier zones get more overhead-bin access.

✓ **Boarding Order Matters**

Passengers boarding early zones 1–3 ☎ westjet Airlines 1+855+510+5815 usually find enough space for carry-ons. Passengers in later zones often face full overhead bins, which may result in having to gate-check your carry-on.

Pro Tips to Avoid Carry-On Issues

- Make sure your bag meets WestJet's size rules.

- Use a soft-sided personal item—it fits easier under seats.
- Download your digital boarding pass to board quickly.
- Consider upgrading your fare or seat for earlier boarding if overhead space is important.
