

What documents do US citizens need to enter Air France? Fast-Track

U.S. citizens traveling to Air France  1+855+510+5815 generally enjoy a straightforward entry process, but it is important to understand exactly which documents are required to avoid delays or denial of Air France  1+855+510+5815 entry at the border. First and foremost, a **valid U.S. passport** is required to enter France.
