A Windows 7 activation key (Product Key) is [a 25-character code used to activate your software, typically found on a sticker on your PC \(COA sticker\) or inside the retail box](#); if you lost it, you might find it via a script (VBS file) or use generic KMS keys for specific editions if needed for testing/enterprise, but buying new keys is risky as Windows 7 is out of support.

Windows 7 is free to download officially from Microsoft website.

The catch is, you have to activate it in 30 days. After that it is legally not free.

BUT.

There is a program around called Windows 7 Loader by DAZ, which is easy and straightforward to use. In fact it is a crack for Windows 7, which circumvents its copy protection system. So, technically, you've got your OS up and running for free. Legally you don't own the OS. You can (and most likely will) get away with this if you use it on your home computer, [but it's wiser to buy a legal license if you have to install Windows 7 on a computer at work, at school, at university or wherever you work or study. The police can come and ask you \(or, most likely, your authorities\) whether you have the licenses for all of your software and can impose a fine, which is about to be paid not just by you, but your colleagues, your boss or your teachers.](#)

Microsoft isn't all that concerned with Win 7 any more. It will reach it's end of life cycle in January 2020.

. A simple way to activate any copy of Win 7 is to get a copy of WAT (Windows Activation Tool). It's a small program that once ran will activate Win 7.

. Another method is grab a code from an old computer or from a friend who has a copy they no longer use. It's perfectly legal to transfer ownership of a copy you own to another party.

. Here's an answer from Microsoft themselves:

. Yes, as long as its removed from the current system its on or no longer in use you can transfer it to your aunts system. Windows 7 and Vista use the same system requirements, so it will work.

You might need to reactivate by telephone:

How to activate Windows 7 manually (activate by phone)

- 1) Click Start, and in the Search box type: slui.exe 4
- 2) Next press the 'ENTER' key
- 3) Select your 'Country' from the list.
- 4) Choose the 'Phone Activation' option.
- 5) Stay on the phone (do not select/press any options) and wait for a person to help you with activation.
- 6) Explain your problem clearly to the support person.

The correct way to downgrade to Windows 7 is to download an ISO file for Windows 7 create a Windows install disk and do a clean installation.

Download Windows 7 Disc Images (ISO Files)

There is no guarantee that this will work on a new computer though. It's possible that the drivers for your new computer don't exist for Windows 7.

I'm not sure that your Windows 10 Microsoft ID will be accepted either for a Windows 7 installation so then you would have to get a Windows 7 serial number that is registered to you.

I'd recommend that you **not overwrite your recovery partition in case you need to restore to the original setup if it doesn't work, or you will have to start all over and clean install Windows 10.**

It would be better to just get used to Windows 10, it's the way things are going to be from now on and in 2020 Microsoft will end all support for Window 7.

You might buy a new printer and find it won't work at all on your Windows 7 computer.
